Processional Hymn Once in Royal David's City, vv. 1, 2, 4

Hymnal 102

- 1) Once in royal David's city stood a lowly cattle shed, where a mother laid her baby in a manger for his bed:

 Mary was that mother mild,
 Jesus Christ her little child.
- 2) He came down to earth from heaven, who is God and Lord of all, and his shelter was a stable, and his cradle was a stall; with the poor, the scorned, the lowly lived on earth our Savior holy.

Bidding Prayer

- ¹⁴ And the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art cursed above all cattle, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life:
- ¹⁵ And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.
- ¹⁷ And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life;

- ¹⁸ Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;
- ¹⁹ In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.

- ³¹ And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS.
- ³² He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David:
- ³³ And he shall reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there shall be no end.
- ³⁴Then said Mary unto the angel, How shall this be, seeing I know not a man?
- ³⁵ And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Eighth Lesson

St. Matthew 2:1-12

- ⁴ And when he had gathered all the chief priests and scribes of the people together, he demanded of them where Christ should be born.
- ⁵ And they said unto him, In Bethlehem of Judaea: for thus it is written by the prophet,
- ⁶ And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel.
- ⁷Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared.
- ⁸ And he sent them to Bethlehem, and said, Go and search diligently for the young child;
- and when ye have found him, bring me word again, that I may come and worship him also.

⁹ When they had heard the king, they departed;

and, lo, the star, which they saw in the east, went before them, till it came and stood over where the young child was.

- ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they rejoiced with exceeding great joy.
- ¹¹ And when they were come into the house, they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down, and worshipped him:

and when they had opened their treasures, they presented unto him gifts; gold, and frankincense and myrrh.

¹² And being warned of God in a dream that they should not return to Herod, they departed into their own country another way.

Lesson St. John 1:1-14

- ¹ In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- ²The same was in the beginning with God.
- ³ All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.
- ⁴In him was life; and the life was the light of men.
- ⁵ And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.
- ⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- ⁷The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all men through him might believe.
- ⁸ He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light.
- ⁹ That was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.
- ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.
- ¹¹ He came unto his own, and his own received him not.

- ¹² But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:
- ¹³ Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.
- ¹⁴ And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.
